



Recall Chris Moreno, 4th District City Councilman



Why should Chris Moreno, 4th District City Councilman be removed from his position?

- Councilman Moreno is in violation of the second paragraph of Revised Statutes of Missouri 79.250: “No personal shall be elected or appointed to any office who shall at the time be in arrears for any unpaid city taxes, or forfeiture or defalcation in office. All officers, except appointed officers, shall be residents of the city..
 - Councilman Moreno has violated this by having **multiple default judgments against him prior to election**, including Higher Education Loan Authority of the State of Missouri, Capital One, HELA of MO, and others.
- Councilman Moreno partially funded his own campaign through donations from his business. Bull Contracting loaned “Chris Moreno 4LS” a total of \$7,526.56 on 3 separate occasions in February 2016. The same business which had over \$30,000 in unpaid billings to a material supplier. Bull Contracting was found in **default judgments** on Aug. 30, 2016.
- Councilman Moreno filed **Chapter 7 Bankruptcy** with \$209,660 in debt on Aug 31, 2016
- Councilman Moreno resigned from the Budget and Finance Committee Sep 2, 2016 – presumably under public pressure due to his personal financial failures
- Councilman Moreno is actively pursuing the **removal or requiring “pre-screening” of public comments** at City Council meetings
 - At the Oct. 13, 2016 city council meeting (one week after a Lee’s Summit Citizen called for Councilman Moreno’s resignation), Councilman Moreno’s brother, Nicholas Moreno, spoke the entire 10 minutes of public comments to ensure no other citizens could speak.

Since Councilman Moreno was elected, his lack of basic understandings of local governance and constant barrages on social media make him unfit to fulfill his term and position. There are too many positive initiatives happening in Lee’s Summit to have a corrupt, disruptive, incompetent councilman representing District 4.

How many signatures must be collected?

- There were 1744 votes cast in District 4 when he was elected. A minimum of 524 **registered District 4 voters** must sign the recall petition.

Will Councilman Moreno get to see the signatures?

- Yes – he has the right to view and verify all signatures as being District 4 voters.

What happens after the recall petition, with 524+ signatures is submitted?

- The recall is then voted on in the next general election which is April 2017.

Once voted out of office, who would take his place?

- Remaining councilmembers will fill the vacancy by appointment. That appointment is valid until the next municipal election.
